Tour of Britain Cycle Race to visit North Curry:

The Tour of Britain Cycle Race will be coming through North Curry on the morning of Friday 16th September, now is the chance to see the action from your doorstep! The race will be starting in East Street, Taunton at 10:15, from where it will head out via Obridge Viaduct, through Monkton Heathfield, Walford Cross, Durston and West Lyng before coming across Moor Lane to North Curry. The route through North Curry will be up Moor Lane, through the Shambles, along the Pavement and down Greenway, then it will head down Newport Hill to the A378 and on to Fivehead. It is expected to reach Fivehead Hill at 10:44. Check the Tour of Britain website for updates on timings.

Please note that there will be rolling road closures of the route from Taunton to Langport between 9:00 and 11:30. Restrictions will only be in place for as long as necessary for the participants to pass, no alternative routes will be given.

M5 Junction 25 Roundabout Reconstruction

Motorists will wish to be aware that a major road reconstruction scheme at the M5 J25/A358 roundabout and on the A358 between the M5 and Southfields roundabout will be starting on Monday 12th September. Work is expected to continue until Tuesday 18th October and will involve sections of the carriageway being closed at weekends (7:00pm Saturday to 7:00am Monday), with lane restrictions being implemented during weekday nights. Daytime traffic "should" be unaffected. If you intend to use the M5 Junction 25 during affected weekends you may wish to check the Somerset County Council website for updated information (www.somerset.gov.uk) or call 0845 345 9155, lines open 8am to 6pm on weekdays and 9am to 4pm on Saturdays.
