HELP PREVENT SURFACE WATER FLOODING - KEEP DRAINS CLEAR! It's that time of year again, if you have a drain near your house please could you keep an eye on the drain cover and clear it of any leaves or debris (particularly on windy recycling days). This should help surface water drain more quickly and reduce flooding in the Parish. If you see that the drain itself is blocked please report it to County Highways by calling 0300 123 2224 (choose the "Roads and Transport" option), or report it online at: www.somerset.gov.uk, choose the "Roads, Parking & Transport" option then "Problems on the Road".

WOULD YOU BE INTERESTED IN ATTENDING DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING? Whilst no training is necessary before using the defibrillator as it gives instructions as you use it, if you think you would be more comfortable about using it following training and would like to attend a 90 minute course please let the Parish Clerk know. If there is sufficient interest a training course will be arranged.

WASTE COLLECTIONS OVER CHRISTMAS: Please note that (with the exception of Monday collections) in the Christmas week all collections will be two days later than usual and in the New Year week all collections will be one day later than usual. There will be NO garden waste collections from Monday 24th Dec. to Friday 4th Jan. All waste collections will be back to normal from Monday 7th January.

Clerk to North Curry Parish Council

Applications are being sought for the post of Clerk to the Parish Council. This part-time post will put you at the heart of this thriving local community and involve a varied workload. Hours of work (typically 62 hours per month) are to some extent negotiable to accommodate the needs of the applicant, but will necessarily involve working at the Parish Office several part-days a week and attending meetings at the Village Hall on an average of two evenings a month. The successful applicant will have a keen interest in understanding local issues and the workings of the District and County Councils, an ability to take minutes and manage the Council's correspondence and accounts, a flexible approach to work and a resilient and outgoing character capable of dealing face-to-face with the public. Computer literacy with knowledge of Word and Excel is required. He or she is likely to live in or close to the Parish.

Remuneration will be in accordance with Local Council pay scales starting in the region of £10.10 per hour plus expenses, dependent upon experience and aptitude.
