KING CHARLES III CORONATION: The Parish council has taken the decision to order a supply of commemorative mugs, presenting a free mug to children in the Parish. We are also offering to supply extra mugs to older children and anyone else in the Parish for £6 per mug. To reserve a commemorative Coronation mug, you will need to apply this year to prevent excess stock. If you are ordering a free mug for a child aged 11 or under: please email parishcouncil@northcurry.com or use the Parish Office post box, and include the child's name, date of birth, and first line of address and postcode. If you are ordering a mug for a child aged 12 and above, or for yourself: please also email or post, including a name, and first line of address and postcode. The cost will be £6, please include payment with your application. If emailing, please use the subject title 'Coronation Mug'. Once the mugs arrive, you will be able to collect them from the Parish Officedate to be announced. Please apply before 15th March.

CORONATION TREE: Your Parish Council have chosen to plant an Oak tree to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III, but would like your say in where this tree should be planted. The options are: Queen Square Gardens, or the Community Woodland on White Street. Please let us know if you think of another option. 

Wetland Conservation on the Somerset Levels

On 15th March, Damon Bridge focusses on the birds of the Levels, especially the cranes. For 30 years, Damon has been with the RSPB, working to protect wildlife habitats and species, with the last 20 years spent on Somerset's Levels and Moors. He's specialized in wetland management – the Somerset Wetlands with their special birds, plants and other creatures are very dear to him, working with some of Somerset's newest species like the cranes, and seeing the transformation of former arable land to thriving wetland nature reserves.

NCS meet at the Village Hall, generally on the third Wednesday each month. Doors open 7:30pm for refreshments, chat and further discussion afterwards. Visitors welcome - £5 for the evening, so it's worth becoming a Member at £15 for the rest of the year up to our AGM in July.
