Going nuclear near you!

Our speakers on 19th April are from the Hinkley Point Community Relations team. Hinkley Point on the Severn Estuary at Bridgwater Bay is one of eight sites in England and Wales announced by HM Government in 2010 as suitable for nuclear power stations. Hinkley Point C (replacing HPA and HPB) has been under construction since 2017. The speakers will describe recent and future developments at this huge construction site.

A third of drivers still ignore village speed limit.

Since the introduction of the 20 mph zone in North Curry in 2021 there has been a slow, but noticeable, change in drivers' habits. Now the electronic Speed Indication Devices (SIDs) are in place it is possible to measure those habits.

The SIDs record the speed of vehicles as they approach, as well as when they have gone past them, and flash up appropriate messages in response to the vehicles' speeds.

SID data shows that one third of drivers are still breaking the 20 mph speed limit. Speeds of up to 71 mph have been recorded!

For those drivers who respect the speed limit, thank you. You help make the village roads much safer for those who walk to the school, the Post Office, Health Centre etc.

When will the remaining third of drivers take the trouble to respect the limit?
