It is a huge job for our few wonderful volunteers to keep on top of, so while out walking, please be a local hero and try to remember to take a pair of secateurs or shears to trim some brambles or nettles.

NEW SIDS COMING SOON: The Parish Council has approved the proposal to purchase and install two SIDs for Wrantage, and now a further SID for Moor Lane. The Parish Council have put a lot of thought and effort into tackling speeding in the village, and the SIDs so far have shown promising results. A huge thank you to all of you who respect the speed limits throughout the parish.

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH: The Community Speedwatch team have done a commendable job fighting speeding in the village. The team has been led by Mr Meehan, the coordinator, who has worked tirelessly on the issue for many years and is now wanting to step down. The Parish Council thank him greatly for all his work. 



This month we are showing a delightful French film: **The Chorus**. It is a wonderful small film underpinned with a powerful message, strong performances and a great musical score.



If you cook no more than three times a year, then you do not have to be registered and visited by the Environmental Health Officer. Or you can use the village hall kitchen. Your energy costs are met by the club. We already have a highly experienced team of six who can help with recipes and quantities if needed and show you a list of past meals. We have a limit of thirty guests with a reserve waiting list currently of six. While our guests greatly enjoy the excellent food it is primarily a social occasion for many live on their own and do appreciate the community get together.


