TREE PLANTING SCHEME: There has been a great response to the Parish Council's tree planting scheme, with 14 residents coming forward so far wanting to plant native trees and shrubs. This scheme aims to replace the many trees in the Parish that have been lost to disease and age. If you believe you have a suitable site for one or a group please of trees contact Phil (phil.stone7@icloud.com or 07826 489523) to discuss the variety of native trees and shrubs available; the plants are 50cm high and protective tubes or spiral guards can be provided free if needed. Planting will be the landowner's responsibility, but Phil can advise on planting and maintenance. The plants are likely to be available from late November and December, but the planting season extends through to March 2024.

The Chalke Newton Band North Curry Methodist Church. November 23rd 7.30. Tickets £10/£5 under 18, with refreshments

The Chalke Newton Band recreates the musical world and sounds of the early Nineteenth century. The trio draw on the music of village, militia, town and theatre bands, Sounds that that people danced to, sung along with, marched to and heard in the theatre, fairs and the circus. The band features fiddle, C Clarinet and the lost sound of England, the Military Serpent.

The band play music found in musicians manuscript books of the time, including the band led by George Mathews in Leighland on the edge of Exmoor and the Hook manuscript in Dorset. Phil Humphries is one of the country's leading serpent players, playing with the London Serpent Trio, The New London Consort and The Gabrielli Players., Along with clarinettist Tim Hill, he also plays in the Mellstock Band, providing music for TV productions like Pride and Prejudice and Tess of the D'Urbervilles. Colin is a member of The Scorpion Band and one of the South West's finest folk fiddle players. Together they make a rich and authentic sound and tell stories of village bands, musicians, fairs, celebrations and protests.
