North Curry and District Amateur Gardeners

Our next meeting is on **Friday 1**st **December** 7:30 for 8:00pm at North Curry Village Hall.

HEAVEN SENT - THE SCENTS OF CHRISTMAS, Alex Dart.

Clove, cinnamon, orange, frankincense, myrrh - the scents of Christmas... and much more.

Scents evoke memories - of childhood, the seaside, roses in an English garden or night air laden with jasmine and gardenia.

Only 1% of plant species contain essential oils - learn more about who they are and what they do.

Alex will talk about the history of these plants and what parts of a plant may contain oil (leaves, rind, bark, roots, flowers, needles and cones, rind, berries, resin and seeds). Taking an oil from each of those groups, she will explain the differences in composition of various oils - e.g. a flower oil such as rose and say an oil from a root (valerian) or a resin (frankincense /myrrh), or rind (orange, lemon). There will be opportunities for the audience to smell the oils.

There is no meeting in January, so our first talk in 2024 in on Friday 2nd February. Greg Morter on "From Seed to Fork".




